

English - Stories from Other Cultures

The children will continue to explore the story 'The Mountains that Roared' by Jess Butterworth by using a range of reading skills. The objectives they will cover are:

- Retrieve and record information
- Drawing inferences and justifying with evidence
- Using dictionaries to check the meaning of words and explaining these meanings in context

From our reading, the children will consider the best techniques for immersing the reader in another culture and will use these techniques to write an engaging story. The objectives they will include are:

- Expanded noun phrases with prepositions
- Fronted adverbials
- Inverted commas
- Conjunctions

Mathematics

The objectives the children will cover:

- recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12×12
- use place value, known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally, including: multiplying by 0 and 1; dividing by 1; multiplying together 3 numbers
- multiply two-digit and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout
- solve problems involving multiplying and adding, including using the distributive law to multiply two digit numbers by 1 digit, integer scaling problems and harder correspondence problems such as n objects are connected to m objects
- measure and calculate the perimeter of a rectilinear figure (including squares) in centimetres and metres

Science - States of Matter

Children will be continuing to study states of matter. The children will cover the objectives:

- Compare and group materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.
- Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled.
- Identify the part played by the evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associated the rate of evaporation with temperature

The children will be working scientifically by making careful observations, setting up simple practical enquiries and using results to draw conclusions.
