Traditional Tales

Mathematics

Key skills taught: place value, measurements of length and mass, addition and subtraction with 2-digit numbers using pictorial representations and properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Children will solve a range of puzzles (including identifying patterns, investigating sequences and formulating rules.) This will help them with their reasoning skills.
